MAIN RESEARCH INTERESTS

I study theory of syntax (the study of the rules that generate all and only the grammatical sentences of a human language). Specifically, I am currently studying the interaction between argument structure (the relations holding between a lexical item—such as a verb, a noun, or an adjective—and its arguments) and conditions of subextraction (the conditions that allow a certain element *E* to be displaced out of the constituent in which *E* is contained) in three different constructions: Latin *tough*-constructions (e.g., *virtus difficilis inventu est* ‘the virtue is difficult to find’), Italian synecdochal complement constructions (e.g., *Gianni è corto di respiro* ‘John is short of breath’), and Sanskrit bahuvrīhi compounds (e.g., *ugraputro devadattah* ‘Devadatta whose sons are mighty’). I also like to study Pāṇini’s grammar (especially compounding and the mapping between *kāraḥ*—roughly translatable as ‘semantic roles’—and Case endings) and ancient languages more broadly.
